Upon review of the file, it has been determined that this docketed appeal is a duplicate of the appeal docketed as OOR Dkt. AP 2016-1451, which was dismissed for lack of jurisdiction by the Office of Open Records (“OOR”) on August 30, 2016. Therefore, this appeal is hereby dismissed as improvidently docketed.

For the foregoing reasons, the appeal is **dismissed as improvidently docketed**, and the Judicial Conduct Board of Pennsylvania is not required to take any further action. This Final Determination is binding on all parties. Within thirty (30) days of the mailing date of this Final Determination, either party may appeal or petition for review to the Commonwealth Court. 65 P.S. § 67.1301(a). All parties must be served with notice of the appeal. The OOR also shall be served notice and have an opportunity to respond according to court rules as per Section 1303. However, as the quasi-judicial tribunal adjudicating this matter, the OOR is not a proper party to any appeal and should not be named as a party.¹ This Final Determination shall be placed on the website at: <http://openrecords.pa.gov>.
