



FINAL DETERMINATION

DATE ISSUED AND MAILED: August 27, 2026

IN RE: *C. Michael Robinson v. Philadelphia Office of the City Commissioners*;
OOR Dkt. AP 2026-3489

Upon review of the appeal filed with the Office of Open Records (“OOR”) to the above-referenced docket number, it is determined that the appeal is **DISMISSED** because:

The appeal is untimely. The Request was received by the Philadelphia Office of the City Commissioners (“City”) on May 21, 2026, and the City invoked an extension of time to respond on May 29, 2026.¹ On June 29, 2026 the City requested and was granted an additional extension of time to respond to the Request, until July 15, 2026.² When the City did not respond within the extension period, the Request was deemed denied on July 16, 2026.³ See 65 P.S. § 67.902(b)(2). Appeals of deemed denied Right-to-Know requests must be filed within 15 business days of the date of the deemed denial, or by August 6, 2026 in this instance. 65 P.S. § 67.1101(a)(1). The appeal was submitted to the OOR on August 24, 2026. The Requester is not prohibited from refileing the Request and, if necessary, filing a new appeal pursuant to the requirements of 65 P.S. § 67.1101(a)(1).

For this reason, the City is not required to take any further action. Within thirty days of the mailing date of this Final Determination, either party may appeal or petition for review with the Philadelphia County Court of Common Pleas. 65 P.S. § 67.1302(a). All parties must be served with notice of the appeal. The OOR also shall be served notice and have an opportunity to respond according to court rules as per 65 P.S. § 67.1303, but as the quasi-judicial tribunal adjudicating this matter, the OOR is not a proper party to any appeal and should not be named as a party.⁴ All documents or communications following the issuance of this Final Determination shall be sent to oor-postfd@pa.gov. ¹ The City’s offices were closed on May 25, 2026 in observance of the Memorial Day holiday.

² The City also denied parts of the Request; however, to avoid the piecemeal resolution of the dispute, the extension is applied to the entire Request.

³ On July 15, 2026, the City requested a further extension of time to respond to the Request; however, the Requester did not agree to this extension, in writing, until August 3, 2026, after the existing extension period had elapsed. Therefore, the Request was deemed denied as a matter of law on July 16, 2026.
